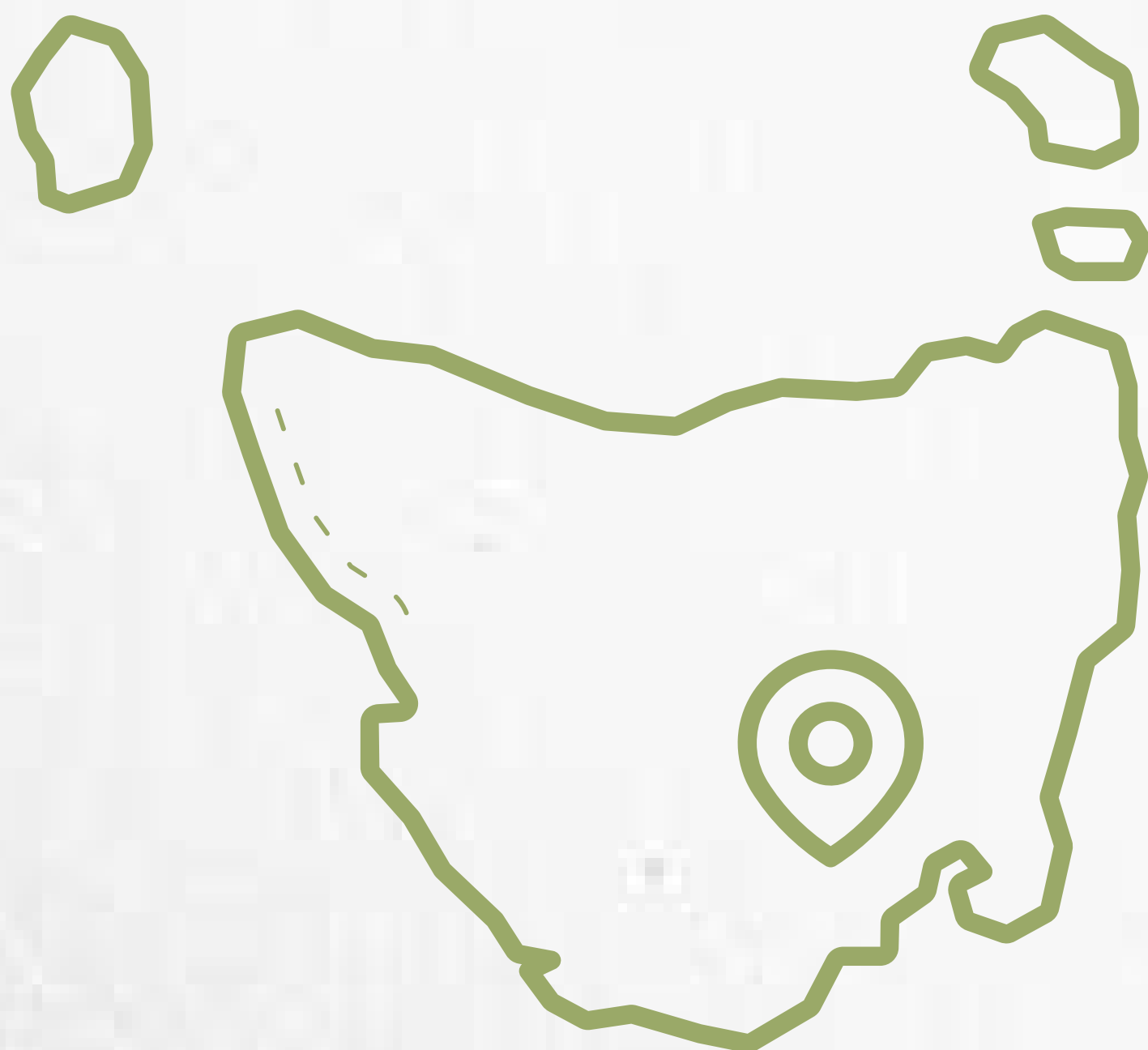

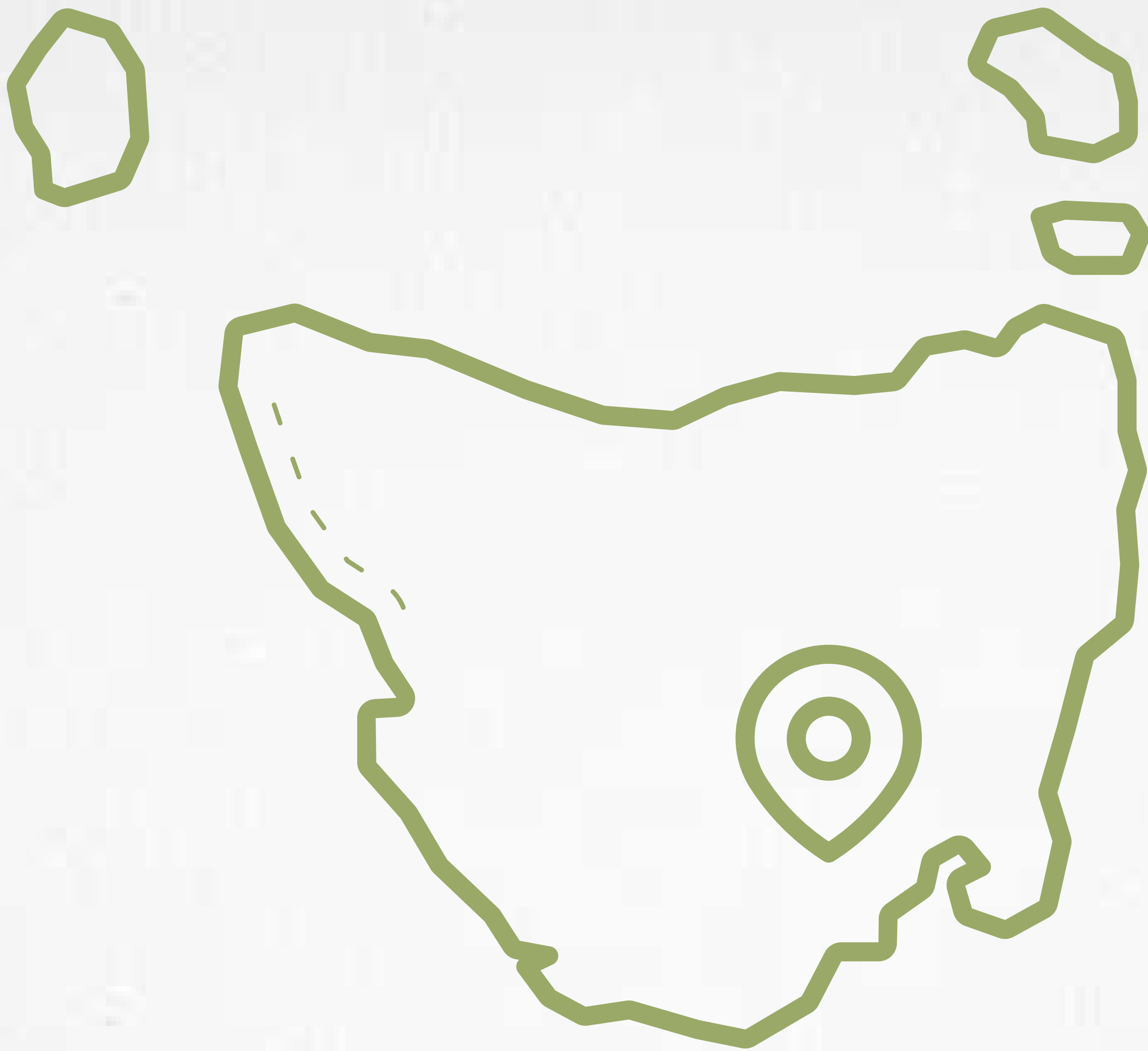

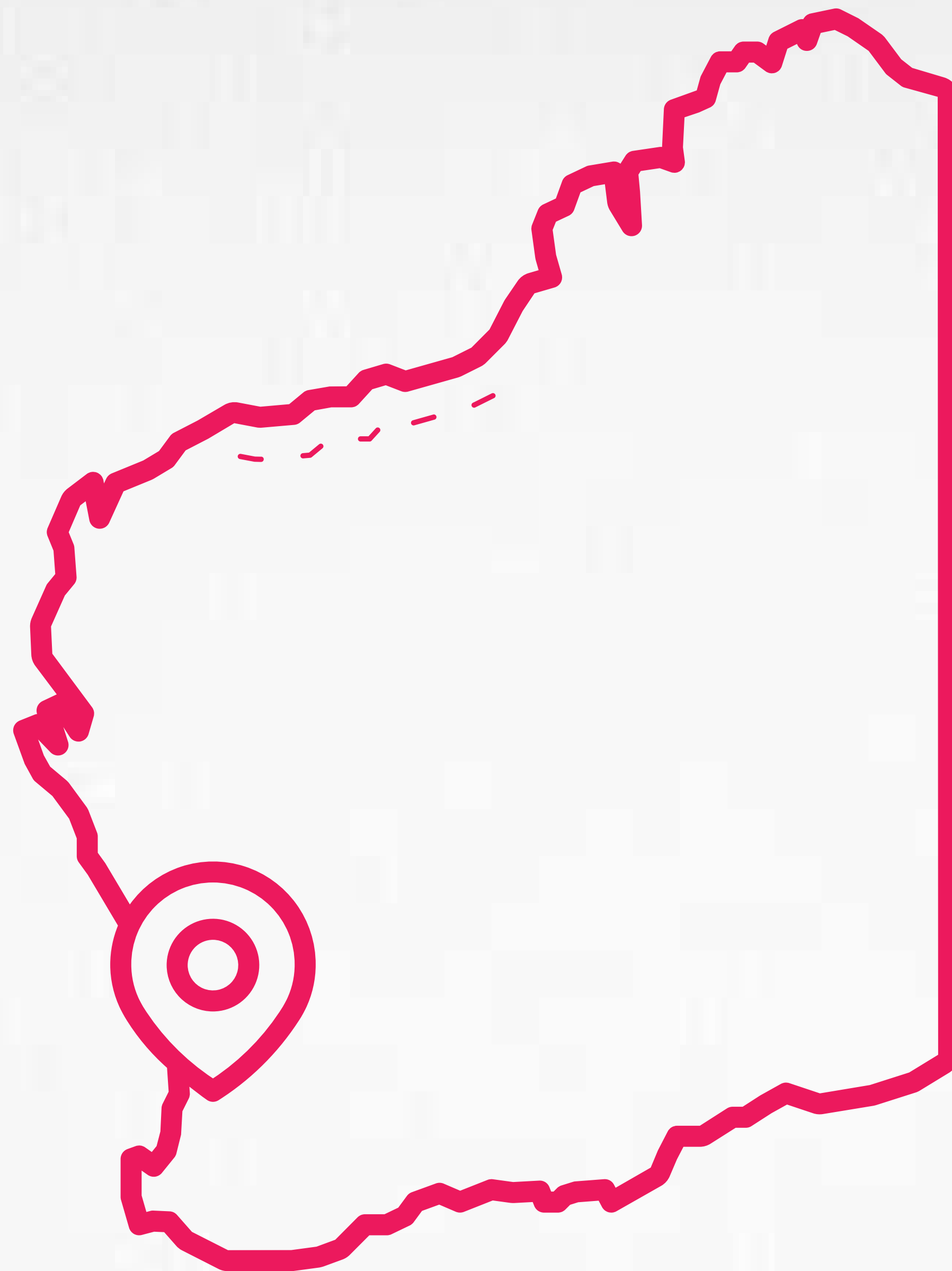
HOBART, TASMANIA
